It is a practical way of giving expression to the Gospel values which are at the heart of the Le Chéile Charter. The day was marked in a number of creative ways in our schools. FCJ Bunclody had a band made up of students from 3rd to 6th year playing at lunchtime beside the tuck shop which lifted everyone's mood! Ard Scoil Raheny had a day full of Random Acts of Kindness. Jesus and Mary College, Goatstown made hearts with 'positive comments' on each one and put them on every students' locker. A highlights for the staff in Jesus and Mary, Salerno was when they received an anonymous note from their Leaving Certificate students. The note was a Thank you to all the staff for all that they do and it was read out to a very happy staffroom during lunch! Our Lady's Templeogue First Years spent an hour in Rathfarnham Shopping Centre helping with bag packing and distributing balloons to small children and giving some coins for the trolleys. Maryfield students received a Handprint (an actual handprint of someone else in the school) – with a lovely thought, affirmation or quote printed on one side of the hand with a number on the reverse side which was entered in a draw. Ramsgrange Community School saw senior students giving out free hugs at lunch and break times and every student and staff got a lollipop. St. Aloysius College, Carrigtwohill had a week of activities including a bake sale for Trocáire and a food collection for St Vincent de Paul. St. Joseph of Cluny Killiney had a short comic drama where the girls acted out some random acts of kindness and displayed the Pay It Forward idea. St. Dominic's College, Cabra had a slideshow running on a TV screen at the student entrance with motivational quotes about kindness for everyone. St. Wolstan's Community School had a photo booth in the Hall and staff and students were invited to come down and show off their smiles and help create a wall of smiles. On Tuesday 26th of January St. Louis High School, Rathmines and St. Mary's Holy Faith Secondary School, Glasnevin joined together to celebrate Catholic Schools Week 2016. St. Mary's students travelled to Rathmines accompanied by their R.E. teachers, Claire Murtagh and Ciaran Coll.

As the theme for this year's Catholic School's Week was 'Mercy', we were mindful that all of the activities organised reflected this theme. The morning began with a talk from Team Hope. Rachel and Carol guided us through the work that the charity carries out and how, behind it all, is the strong belief that showing mercy to others is a way of putting faith into action. The students watched a video showing the joy brought to the children when they open the shoe boxes sent out before Christmas. This talk was included to also reflect the commitment of both schools to Development Education and to encourage our students to look outwards and take responsibility as global citizens. Sr. Finola Cunnane SSL also attended as co-ordinator of the St Louis Network. Once the talk concluded, students and teachers from both schools enjoyed refreshments and discussed the topics raised by Team Hope. This was a wonderful opportunity for all involved to connect with and get to know other members of the Le Chéile community. The day's events concluded with a prayer service which was prepared by both schools in the weeks leading up to the event. St. Louis and St. Mary's students carried symbols, read prayers and sang hymns all centred on the importance of mercy. St. Louis High School's orchestra accompanied the students during the service. Students also recounted the story of how the Sisters of St. Louis and the Holy Faith Order were established. Sharing in this liturgy was a unique opportunity for two Le Chéile schools to come together in prayer, get to know one another and learn about the founding story of each school.

The day was a very enjoyable experience and something that we all hope will be repeated on an annual basis. We are looking forward to St. Mary's hosting next year. We thank the members of the RE and Music departments in both schools for facilitating this wonderful Le Chéile schools' collaboration.
