The Sports Hall meets the requirements for national basketball matches and has already played host to the All-Ireland under-19 Basketball playoffs and the Western Regional Finals, earlier this school year. Salerno is now able to train for and host their own basketball games on site. The Sports Hall is also marked for indoor hockey,

and has four badminton covering the athletics, courts. games, adventure,

Salerno can now provide a full PE programme onsite for the school's 675 students, in accordance with Department guidelines, as opposed to having students travel off campus to other facilities. The PE teachers are delighted with the new state-of-the-art facility and now provide an extensive PE programme that appeals to all students

covering the athletics, games, adventure, dance and health related activities and gymnastics, strands of the PE syllabus.

The Salerno Sports Hall allows the school the opportunity to train many of the school's sports teams and individual competitors and it facilitates and encourages participation in physical activity among the students and staff.
