16th May 2018 was a proud day for Le Chéile and a fitting tribute to the 14 Congregations who had the wisdom and confidence, in 2003, to look to the future. The Trust was set up in 2009 up on a sound footing and when, in 2011, the Minister for Education, Ruairi Quinn announced the establishment of 40 new schools over the next six years Le Chéile took on the challenges of applying to be the patron of one of these schools with enthusiasm. We chose the area of Mulhuddart/Tyrrelstown as we knew it was a new area of Dublin and the majority of schools were community or ETB schools.

Therefore a voluntary secondary Catholic school would provide the required diversity. We started our journey by visiting the priests of the local parishes, Corduff and Ladyswell. They then introduced us to the Principals of the local primary schools who in turn introduced us to their parent groups. A couple of public meetings presented some challenges—including a member of the audience throwing the question in a very loud voice *"how dare you even think of opening a Catholic school here?"*. Maybe the question shouldn't have been a surprise but what was wonderful was the response! Another parent in the hall took the microphone and made it quite clear that they had every right to look for a Catholic school. (contd on p2)

#### **Official Opening of Le Chéile Secondary School Tyrrelstown**

The entire Le Chéile Community came together to celebrate an historic day on our journey together, the official opening of the Le Chéile Secondary School in Tyrrelstown. Students representing sixty seven nationalities, parents, teachers and Congregation

representatives, joined with the guests and the building and design team to welcome An Taoiseach Leo Varadkar and Archbishop Diarmuid Martin for the opening Mass and ceremonies. Students and Principals from other Le Chéile Schools also attended.

The students, staff and choir all participated in a wonderful ceremony that embraced the old and

new, recognised all our founders and celebrated the school's motto: Welcome, Witness and Wisdom aptly. Congregational representatives brought water from their homeplace and it was co-mingled to be blessed by the Archbishop before being brought around the school by teachers to bless all the areas of the extensive building. Continuing the tradition of planting and growth that has marked all our celebrations since Le Chéile and Síol started, the congregations planted a sign with an inspiring line from their founder

> in front of fourteen trees in the courtyard. All the first year students received a sapling when the school opened in 2014 and one student donated his sapling which

was planted by the Taoiseach on the day, reflecting the patience the entire school community displayed as their school was being built literally around them over the past four years.

Visitors wandered around the spacious school and met the

students and teachers. The day concluded with lunch in the General Purpose room where guests could enjoy the beautiful stained glass windows visible from the adjoining Prayer Room with the congregational crests set amongst the reflective images. We would like to sincerely thank everyone who has helped both the Le Chéile office and the school team , in any way, on the journey to this day.
