The projects included studies researching Covid 19 and spending, Sickle Cell Disease and Sports Psychology.

Posi Ashundaro and Lauren Coughlan scooped the top prize in the intermediate category for social and psychology projects at Scifest with their project title 'The Magic Feather'. At the PE Expo in DCU, Kathy Okoeguale, Keren Agbassah and Leah Halpin won two of the top prizes on offer; 1st place in their category and the peer judges award for their project 'Sickle Cell Disease and Sport.' Aimee Keogh and Ashlee Keogh have wrote a student reflection on their experience at the BT Young Scientist Competition which is included inside. We are very proud of the hard work that these three entrants put into their work. No doubt the experience at these competitions will stand to these students long after the exhibition has passed.



TCS Win at the TUD Young Creators Programme 2023










Engineering Week
