Past pupil Fr Columba and his colleague Br John Bosco joined us to discuss their work as **Francisan Friars of Renewal**. They generously shared their story and we learned about their experience of God in their lives. Fr Columba is an accomplished musician and we enjoyed listening as he sang one of his original songs while playing the guitar. Fr Columba's YouTube channel *Called to More* discusses a range of faith topics.

The **Ember Team** held an introduction/icebreaker session with all First Year classes. The team worked with each class for an hour. They introduced their faith leadership role within the school, taught students the Ember prayer and played some icebreaker games.

The team are looking forward to working with all year groups, throughout the year to celebrate and mark important feasts, festivals and liturgical services.

















We were delighted to introduce the Chat and Connect Programme to our Sixth Year students. Once per month each class takes time to ponder a variety of

The focus is on exploration and discovery, leading to action. It has allowed students to meaningfully reflect on these important issues.













Huge Congratulations to Fifth Years Liv Hamilton and Jennifer Dowling who received their John Paul II Awards this week. They began this journey during Transition Year 2022-23.

The award ceremony took place during morning mass in the Sacred Heart and St Brigid Church, Kilcullen. Our current Ember team was present along with Ms Whyte and Ms Bucke. Father Gary Darby celebrated mass and Sister Concepta, from the Dublin Diocese, presented the awards.

The John Paul II Award is presented to students who are committed to their faith and their leadership roles within both the school and parish community. Well done to both students.

Our Retreat Programme has been very successful this term with both First and Second Year students participating in a full day experience.

Our **Second Year Retreat** was facilitated by the *Salesian Youth Team* from Maynooth, and was a day packed with "Faith and Fun". Having started with a Céilí, students were then introduced to the concept of retreat and led through a reflection on Confession and Reconciliation. The Sacrament of Penance was available throughout the day and was well supported by students. The year group was then broken into four smaller groups, with four different workshops offered during the rest of the day. Groups rotated through these, which included prayer, meditation, teamwork and building relationships. The retreat concluded with a beautiful Mass in The Sacred Heart & St Brigid Church, Kilcullen - the summit of the whole day's experiences.

Parents were invited to give feedback on the retreat from their children, and the comments received were very positive. A great day for everyone involved, and a big thank you to the Salesian Youth Team: Fr Cyril, Sr Mary, Zaur, Aisling and Emma.

We pray for all those affected by conflict and war. Students have created cards with


prayers that have been placed around our school to remind us to think of and pray for others who are suffering.
