Mass

On the 10th of October we celebrated our Opening School Mass in Booterstown Parish Church. All staff and students were welcomed at the Mass and we were delighted also to have past pupils and members of the wider community join us. The mass was entirely student led, with the exception of Monsignor O'Carroll, of course! Sion Hill students acted as readers, gift-bearers, Eucharistic ministers, altar servers and ushers as nearly 600 people squeezed into the pews. There was plenty of music to be heard during the liturgy which was provided by the Junior and Senior Choirs, accompanied by the school orchestra and their music teachers, Ms. O'Keeffe and Ms. Wallace. The students who travelled to Lourdes in September had an opportunity to address the entire school and we also had the commissioning of the committees ceremony.



Personal Development

The athletics season has got off to a flying start with our athletes braving the conditions and competition of Cross Country. In the lead up to our forthcoming East Leinster Championships, the Athletics team competed in the Clonliffe Harriers Cross Country Open. The minor team finished a very respectable 4th in the team standings, not bad for their first competition! The junior and intermediate teams also had solid races. However, it was the Senior team who topped off a great day by getting Bronze in the team standings.

History Trip

Our third year History students had a great morning when they visited the Irish Famine Memorial and the Jeanie Johnson Famine ship at Custom House Quay on Thursday the 3rd of October. The tour of the ship was very enjoyable but also very moving. The students learned of the kindness and great medical care that the ship's Doctor, Richard Blennerhassett, showed to the unfortunate people who crossed the Atlantic on the Jeanie Johnson to escape the ravages of The Great Famine. Unlike the other ships that transported the desperate people at the time of the Famine, the Jeanie Johnson had a courageous and humane Doctor on board whose experience and medical knowledge kept the passengers safe from disease and starvation on the trans-Atlantic voyages. The ship's captain James Attridge,

like Dr Blennerhassett, had a professional and humane attitude to the people who were in his care. In all, over 2,500 people escaped the Great Famine or emigrated in later years on board the Jeanie Johnson, including a heavily pregnant young woman named Margaret O'Reilly who was allowed on board even though no other ship's captain would take her. Her baby was born on the voyage (mother and baby survived) and the baby was named after all of the crew of the ship, to honour the crew who had saved him. Uniquely, the Jeanie Johnson never lost a single passenger in all of the 16 trips she made crossing the Atlantic between 1847 and 1965. It was an unforgettable day for the students and the weather even held up!









Hockey

Hockey is off to a great start this year. We have six school squads for friendlies and Leinster league and cup matches.

Crystal Clear Project

As part of the project the students grew eco-friendly crystals that when squeezed can generate electricity! Piezoelectrics are used in electric toothbrushes & even satellites. The project aims to help students learn about the process of growing green alternatives to materials made with lead which damage our environment.



Maths club has kicked off with Ms. Donohoe every Tuesday at lunch time in T4.2. Maths club involves activities such as games, puzzles, quizzes and investigations, maths trails and problem-solving challenges. It is a great opportunity for students who are interested in Maths to further develop their skills in an engaging setting.

Our school hosted the first round of the Mathematics Olympiad. Six students from our school were invited to the Mathematics enrichment classes held in UCD based off their scores in this round. From these enrichment classes a team will be created to represent Ireland in the next Olympiad!

We have also hosted The Maggie Gough Maths Competition which is an online competition which tests the problem-solving skills of Junior and Senior Cycle students. It is named after the first known Irish woman to receive a PhD in Mathematics – Maggie Gough (Sr Mary de Lellis Gough).



If you have already downloaded and an update is available, you can tap 'Update' instead.

When setting up, please allow for push notifications. This way you will be alerted when a message is sent to you.

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Every Day Counts!

As a school we recognise the importance of good attendance for all students. The support of parents and guardians in promoting good attendance is essential.

Parents/Guardians are asked

- To support the school's Attendance Strategy in compliance with their legal responsibilities (Education Welfare Act 2000)
- To ensure regular and punctual attendance of students and avoid unnecessary absences.
- To provide a written explanation for any student absence (using VSware)
- To inform the school in advance of any planned absences from school
- To provide the school with reliable contact telephone numbers and alternative 'emergency' numbers.
- To acknowledge and, where necessary, reply to communications from the school in relation to attendance issues.
- To arrange, where possible, all elective appointments for after school or during school holidays.
- Signing in and out of school: Any student arriving late must sign in at the Office. Any student who needs to leave school early must sign out before departure and sign in again if returning to school on the same day

If you need support with promoting good attendance for your child, please contact the school.
